2023 was another exciting year! We were surprised by the approval of a Federal Appropriations, HRSA Grant for \$2.5M to TriState Health for replacing our MRI and CT Scanner and providing an additional CT Scanner for our Imaging Center. This grant required it to be matched, which TriState Health Foundation committed to and started reaching out to the community for their support of this campaign. A special thank you for the planned gift from the Thomas and Janet Sprute Trust for their significant donation towards the Imaging Center Campaign.

As we look toward the future, we will continue to focus on creating a lasting legacy for TriState Health. We are committed to helping our community with workforce development by launching our new TriState Health Nursing Scholarship Program in partnership with Dr. Wayne and Vivian Day. This exciting new program awards scholarships to nursing students with their commitment to work at TriState Health for a max of two years. Thank you to everyone who as supported this initiative. We look forward to seeing its growth.

We are also launching our TriState Health Foundation Legacy Endowment in the hopes of reaching \$5M over the next seven years to help sustain future needs for TriState Health. The aging of millions of Baby Boomers—those born shortly after World War II—is contributing to increased demands on America's health system. Here in the Lewis Clark Valley, services must expand to meet the needs of our aging population; currently, 26% are over the age of 60, and in the next ten years this number will grow to over 30%. Many of the patients seen at TriState Health face additional challenges, including limited resources or lack of ability to travel out of town for necessary procedures. Making a legacy endowment – or planned gift – to TriState Health Foundation is your chance to make a difference in the health of our community, both today and tomorrow.

Today, philanthropy plays a vital role in continuing the legacy of raising funds to support programs and services, new state-of-the-art medical equipment, technology and infrastructure at TriState Health. As the only non-profit hospital in the Lewis Clark Valley, your dollars stay local and 100% of your donations directly benefit TriState Health. From TriState Health's Chief Executive Officer

At TriState Health, providing high-quality, patient-centered care, close to home is at the core of our mission. It drives our strategy and culture throughout the facilities on both sides of the river, all of which are supported by our Foundation team and Board of Trustees. They are essential for us to continue adding new services, technology, and providers at TriState.

In 2023, we celebrated the opening of the P1FCU Inpatient & Dietary Wing, which was overwhelmingly supported by the community we serve. The construction of the wing was not an easy task and took a monumental amount of teamwork from community partners, hospital departments, the Foundation, and more. I am proud to be a part of the TriState Family during this time of tremendous growth and innovation.

We had our Inpatient & Dietary Wing Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on May 19, 2023, welcomed our first Intensive Care Unit patient into the new wing on August 7, 2023, and the first Medical-Surgical patient on August 8, 2023. Along with our ribbon cutting, we announced our evolved brand which took effect in June 2023.

Our community also supported our new imaging equipment not only through dollars donated, but by also having over 30 local business write letters to our government officials in support of a grant to fund two new CT scanners and a new MRI machine. A room in Imaging has been remodeled and the new CT scanner installed. Our second CT scanner is expected to be up and running this spring, along with our new MRI machine.

Over the past year, just through employee giving alone, the Foundation has supported needed equipment in our facility, including three Automated External Defibrillators, new lobby chairs for the Imaging waiting room, blanket warmers, and more. I am always inspired by the generosity of our own employees each year.

Every business, community partner, and individual, who supports us through dollars donated, or kind words about our facility, is the lifeline of TriState Health. You are the reason our doors stay open and why we can continue to be your only non-profit, community-owned hospital in the Lewis Clark Valley. I want to say thank you for supporting us. I look forward to what 2024 has in store for healthcare in our area!

The Major Giving Initiative – Expand the Dream – is a fundraising campaign for TriState Health's new Inpatient & Dietary Wing. Money was raised through naming opportunities, employee giving, and community donations.

Sustain the Dream (\$116,165)

Sustain the Dream is a fundraising campaign for TriState Health's Surgery Center expansion in which the money was raised through internal campaigns and our community events.

Imaging Center Expansion (\$504,228)

TRAUMA PREVENTION PROGRAM

Stop the **Bleed** Kits

in the Asotin & Clarkston School Districts

Dedicated staff in the Emergency department lead TriState Health's Trauma Injury Prevention Program (TIPP). Each year, the TIPP team focuses on community education to help reduce trauma related injuries that can cause disability or death. The program provides information on ways to reduce injuries and assists individuals and families who are experiencing financial hardship, giving them the tools they need to lower their risk of injuries.

The Trauma Injury Prevention Program is currently facilitating a Stop the Bleed School Project throughout Asotin County. Stop the Bleed's primary purpose is to educate, empower, and equip bystanders to act during a bleeding emergency prior to the arrival of first responders. A person suffering life threatening blood loss can bleed to death within five minutes. Every second counts!

In a partnership with local EMS agencies, TriState Health is providing Stop the Bleed trainings and kits to area schools to assist

with keeping our community safe and saving lives. A TIPP team member attended staff meetings at each school to provide teachers and administrators with the knowledge and subject matter expertise to train other school staff, volunteers, students, and parents on how to treat bleeding emergencies before first responders arrive on scene.

"The commitment to safety, collaboration with emergency responders, and flexibility in scheduling allowed us to provide training across all campus locations. The training was delivered in two sessions at each school," said Donna Franklin, Director of Health Services, Clarkston School District. "Participants were able to ask their questions of knowledgeable providers with firsthand experience in addressing traumatic bleeding."

Trainees learn how to apply a tourniquet, pack a wound, and effectively apply pressure to stop bleeding. Upon completion of the

training, each trainee is provided with a Stop the Bleed Kit for use in life threatening bleeding situations.

"It has been an honor to facilitate and train individuals within both the Clarkston and Asotin School Districts. Equipping our educators with the knowledge and skills for stopping life threatening bleeding has been very well received and rewarding," expressed Michelle Schmidt, RN, TriState's Trauma, Cardiac, & Stroke Program Manager. "Although we hope that these skills never need to be used, we are thankful for the partnership and eagerness within the districts to be prepared for the unthinkable. These Stop The Bleed actions can, and will, save a life."

Stop the Bleed is a grassroots awareness campaign initiated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, originally created for school shootings. Uncontrolled bleeding is the leading cause of preventable death from trauma and the TIPP wants our community to be equipped if an emergency

were to occur. Stop the Bleed kits and training can be used to treat bleeding injuries resulting from car and sport/gym accidents, as well as general accidents that can occur in the school or home setting. Each Stop the Bleed kit cost an average of \$75 and has a shelf life of approximately five years.

"We truly appreciate the opportunity to partner with TriState Health, the Trauma Injury Prevention Program, and Community First Responders to teach staff to recognize life-threatening bleeding and intervene effectively," mentioned Thaynan Knowlton, Clarkston School District Superintendent. "Thank you for

offering another strategy to keep our schools safe. We are grateful for the opportunity to join the efforts of others in the community to create a safer environment for everyone."

Thanks to funds from the TriState Health Foundation with the support from Michael and Brooke Henze with a matching gift from Abbvie, Clarkston Walmart Community Grant, and the Washington State East Region EMS and Trauma Care Council, over 270 Stop the Bleed kits have been distributed to 12 schools with a combined 3,000+

students in Clarkston and Asotin School Districts.

In recent years, TriState Health's Trauma Injury Prevention Program has facilitated various projects with community partners to fund other life-saving tools. These have included providing education on safe swimming and bicycling practices, along with life jackets, helmets, car seats, and headlamps for children.

Imaging Center Room updates, 2 new CT scanners, and 1 new MRI machine (\$2,500,000)

At the beginning of 2022, the Foundation committed to match the \$2.5M Federal Appropriations HRSA Grant approved by legislation for new imaging equipment. Over the last two years, the Foundation has been working diligently to raise funds (\$504,228) from the community. The Foundation is adding \$1,995,772 of its assets to fund the remaining match of \$2.5M, which was paid in 2023 to TriState Health.

In addition to the \$2.5M Federal Grant, TriState Health also received \$100,000 from the Empire Health Foundation. See below for more information on the new imaging machines:

Canon Vantage Fortian 1.5 MRI Scanner

This unit comes with the latest technology to allow us to provide enhanced imaging services such as neuro, orthopedics, vascular, body, and breast imaging. It also comes with the latest software options, including enhanced neurological, liver, and breast imaging applications.

Canon Aquillion 1 Genesis CT Scanner

This sophisticated CT scanner offers a 16 cm detector, equating to greater coverage and faster imaging. It comes with metal artifact reduction and dose reduction software, reducing the number of X-rays the patient receives.

Canon PRIME SP CT Scanner

We are so grateful that this new unit will replace our current CT scanner! It has a 4 cm detector, 160 slice capabilities, and a 78 cm bore (opening), accommodating a larger population.
