# From TriState Health's Chief Executive Officer

At TriState Health, providing high-quality, patient-centered care close to home is at the core of our mission. This commitment drives our strategy and shapes our culture across all our facilities on both sides of the river. These efforts are made possible by the unwavering support of our Foundation team and Board of Trustees, who play an essential role in helping us continually add new services, technology, and providers.

In 2024, TriState Health achieved a significant milestone with the receipt of \$2.5 million in federal funding for our Patient Imaging Project. Thanks to the dedication of the TriState Health Foundation, these funds were matched, allowing us to acquire two new CT scanning machines and one state-of-the-art MRI machine. This project enhances access to imaging services for our three-state, nine-county community, enabling faster and more accurate diagnoses. CT and MRI imaging are crucial in the early detection and prevention of serious conditions such as stroke, cancer, and chronic diseases.

Beyond this remarkable achievement, the Foundation has continued to support critical needs within our facility through the incredible generosity of our employees. Over the past year, employee giving alone has funded essential equipment, including a new electric patient lift, a portable bedside ultrasound machine, Martin Arm Robo-arms, and more. Looking ahead, the Foundation is taking on the vital task of raising funds for a much-needed surgery center update.

Every business, community partner, and individual who supports us—whether through financial contributions or kind words—is the lifeline of TriState Health. Your generosity and belief in our mission ensure that our doors remain open and that we continue to be the only non-profit, community-owned hospital serving the Lewis-Clark Valley. 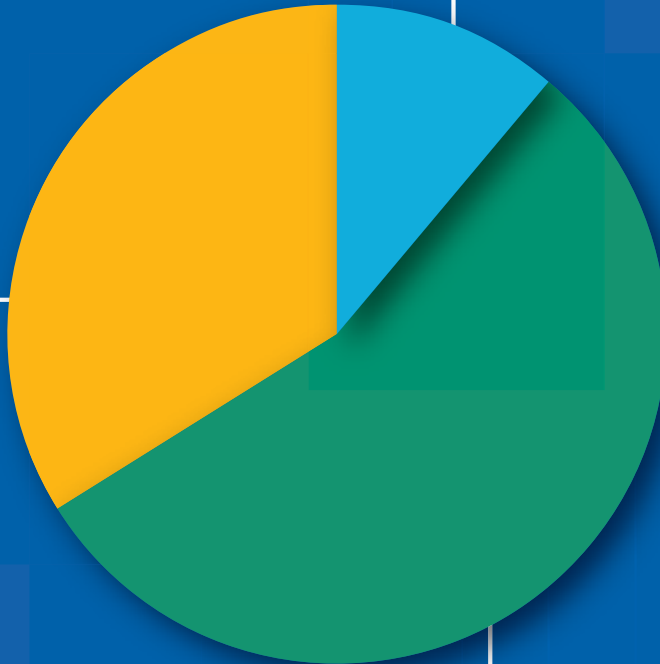

# Building a Stronger Community

## THROUGH A NEW ATHLETIC TRAINING PROGRAM

Over the past five years, Clarkston School District has struggled to employ and retain a certified athletic trainer at Clarkston High School (CHS). This has left high school sporting events without a consistent medical professional onsite, forcing students to rely on volunteers or minimally trained staff for injury evaluation. To address this, TriState Health and Clarkston School District have partnered to provide a full-time certified athletic trainer for the 2024-2025 school year.

The program is supported by the TriState Health Foundation, which was established in 1985 to encourage philanthropic contributions to enhance patient care. Certified Athletic

Trainers are healthcare professionals trained in injury prevention, immediate medical response, and rehabilitation. Having an athletic trainer onsite ensures prompt care, reduces injury risks through prevention, and provides tailored rehabilitation plans for student athletes.

"Having access to an athletic trainer is crucial for the success, health, and peace of mind of all athletes and stakeholders within Clarkston High School athletics," said Brycen Bye, CHS Head Football Coach. He emphasized the importance of having trained medical professionals for both emergency care and routine recovery treatments.

At the start of the 2024 school year, Mika Rives, DAT, LAT, ATC, began his role as CHS's Athletic Trainer, thanks to the support of TriState Health. Certified in Washington and Idaho, Mika earned his Master's and Doctorate in Athletic Training from the University of Idaho. During his academic journey, he gained experience as a teaching assistant, clinic athletic trainer, and sports event medical support.

"As a high school and collegiate athlete, I experienced frequent injuries. That exposure inspired me to pursue athletic training. I had amazing role models who demonstrated how impactful this role can be," Mika shared.

Each school day, Mika prepares for student athletes, addressing their diverse medical needs in a fast-paced environment. Through the 2024 fall semester, Mika recorded over 1,200 treatment interactions with student athletes. He creates personal rehab plans, secures tape for ankles, wrists, thumbs, and more, while also providing quality treatments to student athletes who are unable to practice. He monitors injuries, adjusts treatment plans, and

ensures athletes are ready for practice or games. On game days, he's equipped with medical kits, ready to provide effective care and respond to emergencies, if needed.

Having a consistent onsite athletic trainer reduces sports-related injuries and recovery times. This presence fosters a culture of safety within CHS athletics, where students and coaches become more aware of best practices. Over time, this culture will extend beyond sports, promoting resilience and well-being in other areas of life.

The TriState Health Foundation continues to support initiatives like this to enhance local healthcare services. Community contributions help ensure programs like the Athletic Training Program thrive, keeping the community safe and healthy for years to come.

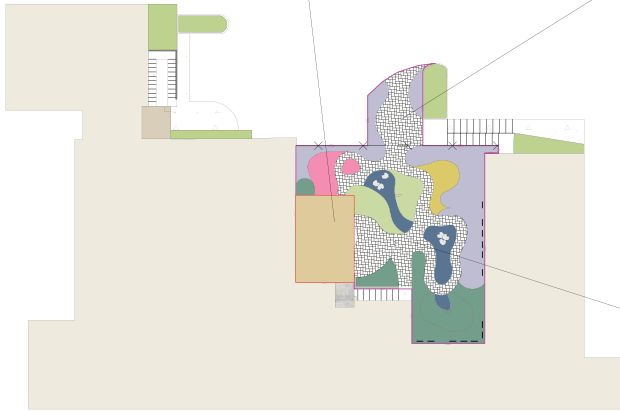

## TriState Health Healing Garden Project:

# Help Their Garden Grow

TriState Health's mission, "Your Health is Our First Priority," remains the guiding focus of TriState Health Foundation. This commitment to providing patients with the best care possible influences every aspect of our work, whether it involves emergency room services, primary provider care, surgery, imaging, or inpatient stays. TriState Health is here to care for you.

However, healing often requires more than modern medicine. Sometimes, it is as simple as connecting with nature to support recovery. Recognizing this, TriState Health is embarking on a project to create a Healing Garden. This garden will promote wellness for patients, families, and staff by addressing not just physical and mental health, but also the spiritual component of healing, which is best nurtured through nature, art, and culture.

Research has shown that spending time outdoors in a peaceful setting can lower blood pressure,

reduce anxiety, calm brain activity, and decrease the production of stress hormones. These effects can lead to quicker recuperation and recovery. A thoughtfully designed garden can ease the minds of patients and visitors, while also offering a restorative space for hospital staff overwhelmed by the demands of their work.

The TriState Healing Garden Project comprises two phases: design planning and implementation. We are thrilled to collaborate with Landscapes by Design and the Nez Perce Tribe to bring this vision to

life. Phase one, which began on July 1, 2024, focuses on overall space design, flora selection, identifying permanent artwork, and incorporating the historical and cultural significance of the Nez Perce Tribe. This phase is scheduled to conclude by June 30, 2025. Phase two, construction, is planned to place from July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026, on the hospital grounds.

Our goal is to raise \$750,000 to create this serene, natural space that integrates nature, art, and culture into a non-clinical setting for rest and rejuvenation. The garden will serve hospital patients, visitors, and staff and be open to the broader community. It will provide a venue for memorial services, gatherings, and other events while serving as an honorarium to the region's cultural heritage.

The collaboration with the Nez Perce Tribe has been invaluable. Their input has guided the selection of plants and artwork that reflect the region's cultural and historical significance. Informational plaques will detail the names of plants in the Nez Perce language, along with their cultural uses and relevance.

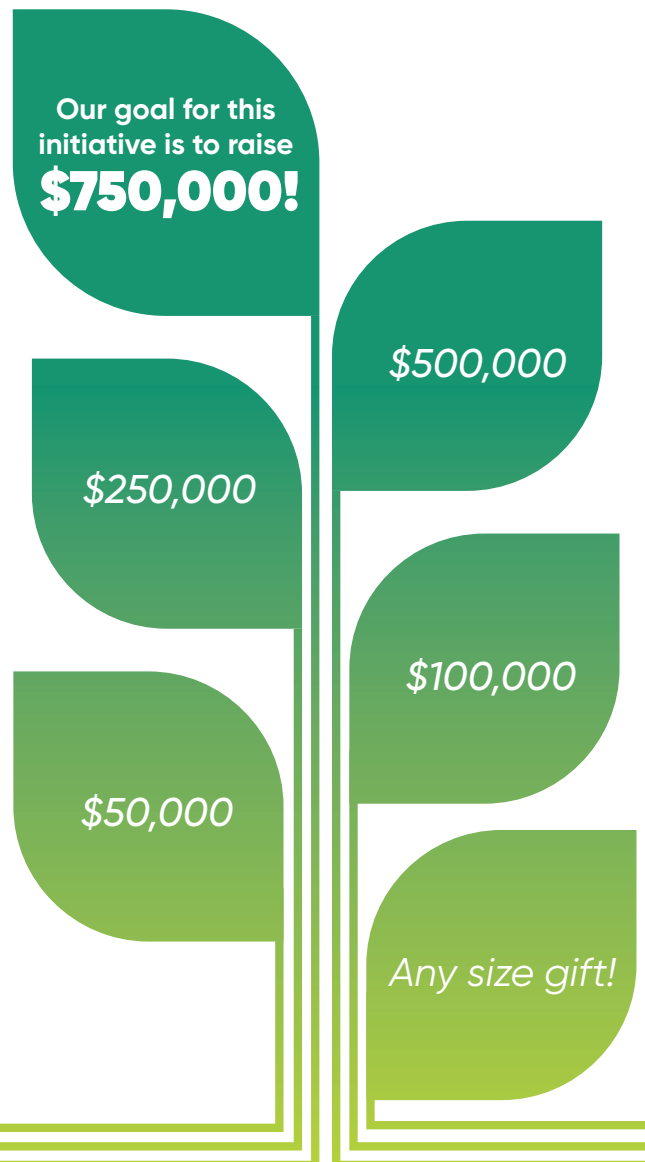

# Expanding and Updating TriState Health's Surgery Center

**T**riState Health has achieved a significant milestone with the construction of the new P1FCU Inpatient Wing. Now, we turn to our community for support in sustaining this achievement by expanding and updating the Surgery Center. There is a pressing need for additional surgical services in the area, and we aim to meet this need through your community-owned, non-profit hospital.

Many patients in our community face challenges such as limited resources or the inability to travel for necessary surgeries. Our population often includes caregivers supporting both children and aging parents, making it challenging to manage the additional expenses of out-of-town procedures, such as lodging or childcare.

TriState Health has taken significant steps to enhance surgical care. Through the following advancements:

- The addition of a da Vinci Surgical Robot, which expands the capabilities of their skilled surgeons. This innovative technology enables minimally invasive surgeries by overcoming the limitations of traditional open surgery. With greater precision and flexibility, procedures ranging from gallbladder and acid reflux surgeries to hernias and colectomies are now less painful, less scarring, and allow for quicker recovery times.
- TriState Health has introduced Mako SmartRobotics™ for orthopedic surgeries. This technology provides unprecedented precision, reduces scarring, and lowers the risk of complications. It is especially

beneficial for patients suffering from arthritis of the knee or hip. Using 3D CT-based planning software, surgeons can create personalized joint replacement plans, ensuring optimal outcomes.

- Additionally, TriState Health has expanded access to urological care. Their Urology team collaborates with primary care providers and other specialists to treat conditions involving the bladder, kidneys, urinary tract, prostate, and male reproductive organs. With advanced technology and diagnostic imaging, they tailor treatment plans to each patient's unique needs.

Women's health is another critical focus. TriState Health's comprehensive services include breast conservation surgery, mastectomy, and sentinel lymph node biopsy, supported by their Breast Health Program. This program emphasizes early detection, patient education, and a variety of treatment plans. Furthermore, their Urogynecology clinic—the only one of its kind in the region—addresses female pelvic conditions such as bladder infections, pelvic pain, organ prolapse, and urinary incontinence.

To accommodate these advancements, they must expand and update their surgical infrastructure. This two-phase project, estimated at \$60 million, includes contributions from state and federal governments. TriState Health has already received \$1 million from the State of Washington. The TriState Health Foundation's goal is to raise \$10 million as part of this campaign. Planned improvements include

an expanded recovery area, enhanced design and workflow, a central sterile processing area, additional Post Anesthesia Care Units, and upgraded patient and staff safety features. These enhancements will directly improve health outcomes and community well-being.

Since its founding by three providers, TriState Health has grown into a multi-site healthcare system trusted by the Lewis-Clark Valley. They continue to invest in advanced technologies such as Aquablation Therapy, Anjo Maxi Sky Patient Lifts, wound care innovations, and new imaging equipment. Looking to the future, TriState Health remains committed to meeting the healthcare needs of their community.

We invite you to join us in the evolutionary effort. Your support will ensure that TriState Health not only meets the growing demand for surgical services, but also continues to provide cutting-edge care. Together, we can sustain the dream and build a healthier future for everyone.
