

A LEGACY OF CARING

Investing in TriState Health's Family Medicine Residency Program

For Dave and Sharon Mudra, giving back has never been an obligation, it has always been a natural extension of who they are.

Dave and Sharon met in 1965 and collectively they built their lives around education, service, and caring for others. Dave taught history and economics for nearly three decades, helping students understand the practical skills they needed to succeed in life. Sharon taught alongside him in physical education. She coached, advised, and mentored generations of students. Together, they helped shape the future for hundreds of children. Their classrooms, gymnasiums, and athletic fields were filled with young people who saw them as trusted adults, role models, steady supporters, and family.

After retiring, the Mudras moved to Clarkston in 1999 to care for Sharon's mother. They later provided care to additional family members, including Dave's aunt, Harriet, for nearly a decade. Caring for their elders, walking alongside loved ones through significant medical challenges, and experiencing healthcare up close shaped their belief in the importance of strong, accessible, local medical services. "We've watched a lot of family go through medical problems over the years," Sharon said. "We feel like supporting TriState Health was the thing to do, a local hospital that offers such great services."

Since settling in the Lewis-Clark Valley, TriState quickly became an anchor in the Mudras' lives. From routine care to urgent needs,

they relied on TriState providers often, and they personally saw the compassion and dedication that define community-owned healthcare. "We just believe TriState does things the right way," Sharon shared. "Patients come first. It's all about care. Not profit."

Their philanthropy to TriState began long before the hospital announced its new Family Medicine Residency Program. Over the years, Dave and Sharon contributed to imaging upgrades, expansion projects, and other initiatives that enriched local care. They attended fundraising events, connected deeply with staff, and became champions for the hospital's mission.

But their generosity extends far beyond healthcare. Throughout their years in the Lewis-Clark Valley, the Mudras have quietly supported numerous local nonprofits and community causes, including education levies and initiatives, the animal shelter, Habitat for Humanity, public radio and TV, and organizations needing help meeting essential needs. Giving locally, they said, has always been their way of strengthening the community they love. "We've been very fortunate in our lives," Dave noted. "If we can help a little here and a little there, that's what we want to do."

When they learned about TriState Health's new residency program, the Mudras knew immediately they wanted to support it.

TriState Health is currently in the planning phases of launching a Family Medicine Residency Program, one of only four residency programs in the nation hosted by a

Critical Access Hospital. Developed with academic sponsorship from Washington State University's Elson S. Floyd College of Medicine, this program aims to address the urgent need for primary care providers in rural Washington and the Lewis-Clark Valley.

For the Mudras, that partnership made the decision to give even more meaningful. Both Dave and Sharon attended Washington State University, giving them a lifelong connection to the institution. They have supported the Elson S. Floyd College of Medicine for years, believing in its mission to train physicians who serve Washington's communities. Supporting TriState's new residency program felt like a natural progression, an opportunity to strengthen the connection between the medical school they believe in, and the local hospital they trust.

The Mudras believe this effort is not only timely but essential. "When we found out about the program, we jumped right in," Sharon said. "It's such a great idea. We need to keep doctors local."

Their belief is rooted in personal moments of care. After the passing of their longtime primary physician, the Mudras transitioned to TriState Family Practice & Internal Medicine where they quickly felt the strength and compassion of TriState's clinical team. They have also experienced firsthand care from TriState Minor Care, TriState Emergency, and have spent time in the PIFCU Inpatient Wing. The reliability, continuity, and personal nature of TriState's providers and every individual who

touched their journey has reinforced their desire to help bring more providers to the area.

"The doctors in this program will get excellent training," Sharon noted. "And if some of them stay in this community, that would be wonderful. We just don't have enough doctors and rural communities really feel that."

When asked what message they would share with future physicians or community members, Dave and Sharon's answer was simple: "Nothing in life is free. If you want quality healthcare and want to be well taken care of, you should be willing to support the people providing it."

Their philanthropic philosophy is one of gratitude and responsibility. They have saved diligently throughout their lives and now they feel privileged to invest in causes that make life better for others. They have also included TriState Health Foundation in their legacy giving plans, passing forward their commitment to community health for future generations. "We just want to make life better," Sharon said. "Hopefully our legacy is that we did something good."

The Mudras' generosity will directly support the creation of a residency program that will train the next generation of family doctors, providers who understand rural medicine, who choose meaningful patient relationships, and who may stay to serve the Lewis-Clark Valley for decades to come.

Their gift is more than a donation, it is an investment in people, in local healthcare, and in the belief that small communities deserve world-class medical care close to home. TriState Health is deeply grateful for Dave and Sharon's vision, trust, and unwavering commitment to strengthening the future of healthcare in our region. Their story is a reminder of what community philanthropy makes possible and how lifelong educators can continue changing lives long after retirement.

D'Lynn's Story



Before it became a campaign, the Healing Garden was a lifeline. In this personal reflection, D'Lynn Ottmar, Chief Development Officer of the TriState Health Foundation, shares the moment she discovered how a quiet space in nature can bring clarity, comfort, and strength during life's most difficult decisions.

I never imagined that one of the most difficult decisions of my life would be made in a garden. I'm D'Lynn Ottmar, Chief Development Officer at TriState Health Foundation. In September 2018, I moved back home to the Lewis-Clark Valley to help care for my parents and be closer to family, not realizing how little time I had left with my dad.

In May 2019, my dad became ill. At first, we thought it was a cold or the flu, but it wasn't. One day, he collapsed and was rushed to Spokane. I received a call telling me he needed emergency surgery. After a harrowing procedure and days in the hospital, doctors sat us down to explain his condition and the options before us. None of them were easy and none offered the future we hoped for.

At some point, the responsibility fell to me to make a life-altering decision: whether to let my dad go. I needed air. I needed space. I needed somewhere to breathe.

Across the hall from my dad's hospital room was a garden. As I sat there on the phone with my aunt, explaining my dad's condition and the choices we faced, I could hear her grief and fear echo my own. Inside the hospital were beeping monitors, bright lights, and clinical conversations. Outside was quiet. There was greenery, fresh air, and a place that allowed me to slow down.

Sitting in that garden didn't erase the pain, but it softened the edges. Watching the leaves move in the wind, seeing bees drift from flower to flower, hearing birds sing...it grounded me. It gave me the privacy and clarity I needed to focus, to breathe, and to make a decision that would forever change our lives.

In that space, surrounded by nature, I found the strength to do what I knew my dad would want,

even though it broke my heart. The garden didn't make the decision for me, but it made it possible for me to face it. That experience is why the Healing Garden matters.

Every day, families are asked to make impossible choices during moments of deep vulnerability. Providers and nurses carry the weight of delivering devastating news. A Healing Garden offers more than beauty, it offers peace in chaos, comfort in grief, and strength when it is needed most. Today, TriState Health Foundation is seeking visionary partners to help raise \$750,000 to create and sustain this sacred space for generations to come, so it is available for every patient, family member, and employee who needs a place to pause, gather strength, and breathe.

Joanne's passion for TriState Health, along with her love for vintage fashion, inspired her to start the Holiday Tea and Vintage Style Show, now known as the High Tea, which continues today in her honor.

Supporting TriState Health is a true family tradition for the Arnones. Scott began volunteering on the TriState Health Foundation Board of Trustees in 1991 before joining the TriState Health Board of Directors in 1997. Lori contributed for many years as a Festival of Trees designer—a tradition now carried on by their daughters, Adrianna Druffel and Jade Arnone. Trevor Arnone has served on the TriState Health Foundation Board of Trustees since 2013.

The Arnone family embodies a commitment to honoring the past, strengthening the present, and investing in the future of their community. A NIGHT TO REMEMBER:

FESTIVAL of TREES



The 41st Annual Festival of Trees, presented by the TriState Health Foundation, was nothing short of extraordinary. It was a powerful celebration of generosity, creativity, and community spirit that will be remembered for years to come.

In November 2025, the Clearwater River Casino & Lodge Event Center glowed with holiday magic as dozens of beautifully decorated trees, each designed by local businesses, families, and community partners, filled the room with warmth and wonder. What unfolded over the course of the Festival went far beyond tradition. It became a defining moment for local healthcare and a testament to what is possible when a community comes together with a shared purpose.

Thanks to remarkable community support, the Festival raised an unprecedented \$1,088,768, making it the most successful fundraising event in the TriState Health Foundation's history. These funds will directly support the expansion of critical healthcare services in the Lewis-Clark Valley, ensuring patients and families can access high-quality care close to home.

A defining moment of the evening came during the live auction with the show-stopping tree titled, "Christmas in the Canyon." What began as spirited bidding quickly became a powerful display of generosity and shared commitment. The final bidding unfolded

between Gary and Jutta Hughes and Cristina Wright, whose enthusiastic participation helped elevate the moment into Festival of Trees history. Cristina's willingness to bid boldly and wholeheartedly reflected her deep belief in the mission of TriState Health Foundation, and her involvement made the record-breaking outcome possible. When the Hughes family ultimately secured the tree with a \$420,000 bid, the room erupted in applause, recognizing not only the historic total, but the extraordinary generosity demonstrated by everyone involved.

Inspired by the rugged beauty of Hells Canyon and the Snake River, "Christmas in the Canyon" was a stunning tribute to the region's landscape and sense of adventure. The tree was brought to life through a collaboration of local designers whose creativity and craftsmanship captured the spirit of the Northwest and the heart of the Festival. Designers included Karrie Hughes Kay (Hughes Foundation), Debbie Zenner (DZ Design), Kaitlyn Loseth (Stonebraker McQuary), and Randi Kilcup (Inland Cellular). The display was anchored on a handcrafted jet boat base fabricated by students from Walla Walla Community College's Clarkston Campus welding program, adding a meaningful layer of local pride and ingenuity.

The impact of the evening extended well beyond the tree auction. During the Raise the Paddle portion of the program,



approximately \$380,000 was raised in support of the Foundation's Surgery & Clinic Expansion, helping advance expanded surgical capacity and outpatient services. A transformational gift of \$250,000 from Chris Schmidt, given in honor of the late Rick Wasem, and two \$25,000 donations from Don McQuary and the Arnone Family further underscored the powerful role philanthropy plays in shaping the future of healthcare in our region.

While the numbers were historic, the true success of the 41st Annual Festival of Trees was found in the shared sense of purpose that filled the room. Sponsors, designers, volunteers, donors, and attendees came together in a joyful reminder that investing in healthcare is an investment in one another, in neighbors, families, and future generations.

As D'Lynn Ottmar, Chief Development Officer of TriState Health Foundation, reflected, "This year's Festival of Trees was epic, it showcased what makes this community extraordinary. Every gift, large and small, reflects a commitment to ensuring everyone in the Lewis-Clark Valley has access to exceptional healthcare."

As the lights dimmed and the final bids were called, one thing was clear. The Festival of Trees continues to be a beacon of hope and generosity. The 41st Annual Festival of Trees not only exceeded expectations, it strengthened the Foundation's ability to serve, heal, and grow alongside the community it proudly supports.
